Came the parties, by and through counsel, from September 12, 2022, through September 14, 2022, for trial in the above-styled action, before the Honorable E. Jerome Melson, Judge, and a jury of good and lawful citizens, to wit:

who, being duly elected and sworn according to law to try the issues joined and a true verdict render according to the law and evidence heard in the case and, that after receiving the testimony and evidence and the jury instructions approved by all counsel of record, were then subjected to a blind and random selection of one (1) juror, as an alternate. Emma Rose Thomas was selected as the alternate-juror as a result of the blind and random selection by this Court and was excused, following which, the jury retired to deliberate a verdict and, then returned to open court and

delivered a completed Jury Verdict Form and announced their unanimous verdict through Foreperson, Tonya Rose Vaughn, in which the jury awarded damages to plaintiff, Julie Jenkins in the itemized amounts of \$1,500.00 for past pain and suffering and \$6,000.00 for lost wages and awarded \$0 damages to plaintiff, Cody Jenkins concerning his claim for loss of consortium.

In consideration of the findings of the jury, it is therefore, **ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED** that a Judgment shall be awarded to plaintiff, Julie Jenkins against defendant, Jacob Adams in the amount of Seven Thousand-Five Hundred and 00/100 Dollars (\$7,500.00) and that the action of plaintiff, Cody Jenkins shall be dismissed with full prejudice.

It further appearing to this Court that Offers of Judgment were served on the plaintiffs by the defendant, through their legal counsel pursuant to the provisions of *Tenn. R. Civ. P. 68*, on May 15, 2018, as evidenced by a Certificate of Service filed with the record of this Court and, it appearing that the Offer of Judgment to plaintiff, Julie Jenkins was in the amount of Ten Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$10,000.00) and the Offer of Judgment to plaintiff, Cody Jenkins was in the amount of One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) and, it further appearing from the record of this matter that the Offers of Judgment were not accepted by the plaintiffs in the manner and within the time required by law and, it further appearing from the findings of the jury, that the judgment finally obtained by the plaintiffs is not more favorable than the Offers of Judgment, it is further **ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED** that the statutory costs of this matter shall be taxed as follows:

1. All statutory costs in this matter under Docket No. 1-206-17 accruing **after May 15, 2018**, are taxed against the plaintiffs, jointly and severally as principle and Brewer & Terry, P.C., 1702 Morristown, Tennessee 37816-2046, as surety, for which execution may issue, if necessary;


2. All statutory costs in this matter under Docket No. 1-206-17 accruing **before May 15, 2018**, shall be taxed to the defendant c/o Terrill L. Adkins, Trammell, Adkins & Ward, P.C., P.O. Box 51450, Knoxville, Tennessee 37950, for which execution may issue, if necessary.


