DEFENDANT ROBERT WASSON, M.D.'S PRETRIAL COMPLIANCE STATEMENT

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Plaintiffs are expected to call Dr. Weakley-Jones to offer expert testimony consistent with her expert disclosure and deposition. To the extent Plaintiffs do not call Dr. Weakley-Jones as a witness, Defendant reserves the right to play and/or read portions of her deposition testimony.

- 16. Defendant reserves the right to call representatives of the Medical Center at Bowling Green for the purposes of authenticating and/or laying the foundation for admission of certain evidence.
- 17. Defendant reserves the right to call employees of the Medical Center at Bowling Green to discuss their care and treatment of Mr. Rich.
- 18. Defendant reserves the right to call any health care providers of Mr. Rich for the purpose of discussing their care and treatment of him.

В. Physical Evidence to be Presented at Trial

Defendant does not expect to present any physical evidence at trial but reserves the right to introduce any such evidence based upon other evidence admitted at trial. Defendant further expects to use illustrative materials at trial, but these will not be admitted into evidence.

C. **Documents to be Presented at Trial**

- 1. Medical Records of Roger Rich;
- 2. Photographs taken at Autopsy of Roger Rich;
- 3. CV's of Expert Witnesses to the extent determined admissible by the Court;
- 4. Plaintiffs' Complaint;
- 5. Plaintiffs' Discovery Responses;
- 6. Defendant reserves the right to introduce other documents based upon other evidence admitted at trial; and
- 7. Defendant reserves the right to refer to and/or rely upon other documents for illustrative purposes.

D. **Statement of Defenses**

1. Defendant intends to prove that he provided reasonable medical care to Mr. Rich. This defense will be supported by the medical records, his own testimony, and the testimony of expert witnesses.

- 2. Defendant intends to prove that Mr. Rich did not die because of hypovolemia, but rather Mr. Rich suffered a cardiac event secondary the complications originating from his kidney biopsy. This defense will be supported by the medical records and the testimony of expert witnesses.
- 3. Defendant intends to prove that Plaintiffs are not entitled to recovery of damages being sought. This defense will be supported by legal argument and introduction of evidence from the witnesses set forth above.
- 4. Defendant intends to prove that he is entitled to apportionment of any liability with the original co-Defendants. This defense will be supported by the medical records and the testimony of expert witnesses.

Ε. Offers of Stipulation

- 1. Defendant is willing to stipulate to the authenticity and admissibility of Mr. Rich's medical records from the Medical Center at Bowling Green. Defendant is also willing to stipulate to the authenticity and admissibility of other medical records depending on agreement as to the relevance of any such records.
- 2. Defendant is willing to stipulate to the authenticity and admissibility of photographs taken by Dr. Weakley-Jones.
- 3. Defendant is willing to stipulate to the negligence of Dr. Isaac, Dr. Sims, Southern Kentucky Nephrology, and/or employees of the Medical Center at Bowling Green.
- 4. Defendant is willing to stipulate to the scope of examinations of the parties' respective expert witnesses with respect to bias and collateral matters involving their qualifications as expert witnesses.
- 5. Defendant is willing to discuss any other evidence and stipulations that can be reached to efficiently present this case to a jury.

F. **Concise Statement of Issues of Law and Facts**

- 1. The primary issue in this case will be whether Dr. Wasson provided reasonable medical care to Mr. Rich and whether any alleged deviation(s) from the standard of care caused Mr. Rich's death.
- 2. Defendant has filed a number of Motions in Limine that raise evidentiary issues to be decided by the Court.
- 3. Defendant expects that the Court will be asked to determine what measure(s) of damages Plaintiffs may submit to the jury.

4. Defendant expects that there will be other issues of law and fact to be decided by the Court as evidence is presented at trial.
